24	WHO	<p>Based on WHO's offer of assistance, the Union Secretary for Health &amp; Family Welfare had requested WHO India Office in the morning hours of Saturday Aug 7th to augment the medical relief supplies from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (M H&amp;FW) to Leh. With the active support of the EHA division of WHO-SEARO, the WHO -India Country Office team worked closely with the EMR Division of the DGHS, MoH&amp;FW, GoI and mobilized one Interagency Emergency Health Kit (IEHK) which was transported by a special sortie of the Indian Air Force to Leh on Sunday Aug 8th early morning</p> <p>Following the Tsunami in 2004, the WHO - India Country Office in collaboration with the Armed Forces Medical Services of India had developed the prototype of a Portable Laboratory Kit (PLK 06) designed to provide support primarily for post-disaster disease surveillance and additionally cater for clinical diagnostic support in the immediate recovery phase following a disaster. One of these labs had been installed at the National Center for Disease Control at Delhi. The Ministry of H&amp;FW had decided to shift the PLK 06 stationed at NCDC, Delhi to the Leh hospital in order to quickly re-establish the critical laboratory services needed. This got airlifted on Monday morning, 9<sup>th</sup> August 2010.</p>		
25	UNFPA	<p>UNFPA had pre-positioned 55,000 women's dignity kits with SDMA, Bihar last year. Out of these, 5000 kits were airlifted by NDMA to Leh on 10th August 2010.</p>
